At PACT, all people have a responsibility for creating a safe work environment. To achieve this, PACT management and employees will:

- Demonstrate leadership and commitment through all its managers and supervisors.
- Provide and maintain a healthy and safe work environment, including work conditions, for the
 prevention of work-related injury and ill health for everyone within our workplaces and persons
 who encounter our operations.
- Monitoring key performance indicators associated with the objectives and implement actions to meet targets and continually improve health and safety management.
- Provide an adequate health and safety management system that is integrated into the business processes.
- Provide information, training, instruction, and supervision to employees (and contractors where applicable) to enable work to be conducted in a safe, healthy, and efficient manner.
- Take all practicable steps to eliminate hazards and reduce work health, safety and welfare
 risks within the workplace through hazard identification, risk assessment, control, and
 monitoring to ensure ongoing effectiveness.
- Comply with all applicable health and safety legislation, codes of practice, standards, and guidelines.
- Provide effective and meaningful consultation and encourage participation of employees and other stakeholders regarding issues that may affect their health, safety and welfare.
- Build a culture that encourages open reporting of incidents and other occurrences to learn and share knowledge and information gained.
- Provide effective rehabilitation and counselling where necessary.
- Allocate appropriate resources to meet the commitments of the policy.

All persons involved in, or working for PACT, are responsible for:

- The health and safety implications of their own actions and each has a duty to carry out their work in a manner which does not present a risk to themselves or others.
- Reporting all incidents and hazards so that appropriate review and action can be taken.
- Suggesting improvements to facilitate continual improvement of the health and safety management system.
